ORDINANCE NO. 2008-O-24

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING  
NO STOPPING OR STANDING ZONES

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Marshall, Illinois:

Section 1. That Division 3 of Article III of Chapter 82 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Marshall, Illinois is hereby amended by adding a new section, which section shall be numbered Section 82-118, and which section shall read as follows:

**Sec. 82-118. No stopping or standing zones designated.**

No vehicle shall be stopped or made standing in the following streets within the boundaries indicated (as used in this section the term *standing* shall mean to cause a vehicle to temporarily lose its motion):

*North Seventh Street*, both sides, between Lincoln Drive and Cedar Street

Section 2. If any provision of this Ordinance, or application thereof, is held invalid by any Court, other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application shall not be affected, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form and shall take effect ten (10) days after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.


